Several years ago, after a visit to TRUMPF Headquarter in Ditzingen I was given a small gift, a copy of the life story of Berthold Leibinger1. It was a story of personal commitment and dedication to his company, his region and country and to his family. The questions that I asked was: Were people committed like the pig in the Irish breakfast or just interested, like the chicken, donating an egg for the breakfast.
